Relocating to the UK presented both financial and emotional challenges. As I embarked on my journey as a master's student, the initial difficulties were daunting. However, as a Christian, I entrusted everything to God. The scripture from Matthew 19:26 often came to mind, reinforcing my faith.

"Jesus looked at them and said, "With man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible."

My academic pursuits demanded not only intellectual rigour but also personal growth, especially in embodying the fruits of the Holy Spirit such as gentleness, tolerance, and compassion, as taught in Galatians 5:16, 22-23. This scripture advises,

"Walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh... The fruit of the Spirit includes love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Against such things, there is no law."

Teamwork is essential in project management, and our assignments often required collaboration. Coming from diverse backgrounds, my team faced challenges such as language barriers and differing attitudes, which initially led to

misunderstandings and missed meetings. Overcoming these hurdles was crucial, and I strove to seek input and guide our team toward our goals.

This proactive approach did not go unnoticed. My behaviour caught the attention of our lecturers and module leaders, leading to my appointment as the class representative for over 200 students. This role, along with my academic performance, earned me several awards and recognitions from both the department and the school.

Through these experiences, I learned the importance of letting God guide me and the value of being coordinated and proactive in all situations. My advice to others is to allow the Holy Spirit to lead and direct their actions, no matter where they find themselves.
