How and why to 'read' the Bible in a year - Part 2 | Malcolm Cox | Quiet Time Coaching Episode 554

Introduction

Last year, I decided to find a way to have a better feel for Scripture as a whole. Today I would like to tell you the method I used. I am not suggesting you do exactly as I did, but perhaps it will inspire you to develop your own plan.

Let me share my four-step, three-app plan.

1. Open Bible

- My Bible software app of choice is <u>Accordance</u>. I've been using it for 20 years. However, you can use any Bible software whether in an app, or online.
- The 'Chronological Bible' is one of the modules available in Accordance. It contains a plan to read all of the Bible in 12 months. I found this useful because it meant I didn't have to calculate the number of verses or chapters to read each day. One less thing to think about is always helpful!
- Step one bring up the day's reading.

- Step 3 I open my mail client and paste the text into the message field.
- You will see in the image below that I am sending the text to an app called 'Reader'. I will introduce that in a moment.



- Often I do this via headphones as part of my prayer walk, or while doing mindless chores.
