How to make the Bible your 'hobby'. Part 3 - Bible Journalling | Malcolm Cox | Quiet Time Coaching Episode 557

#### Introduction

In this series, we are exploring how approaching our Bible study as a hobby can make all the difference. Today we are looking at Bible journalling.

#### 1. Write Down What God Reveals

I am currently reading <u>David Hoffbrand's 52 Sabbaths</u>. This book offers practical insights on how embracing a rhythm of rest can deepen our relationship with God. 52 weekly reflections encourage readers to rediscover the Sabbath as a gift, fostering spiritual renewal, peace, and a closer walk with God.

Once a week, I proceed as follows:

- 1. Read the chapter, contemplate the Scriptures and pray about anything that arises for me.
- 2. Open my Notes software and create a note for that day's reading.
- 3. Note down the main Scripture(s)
- 4. Add any quotes from the chapter that stood out
- 5. Add my reflections in my own words. Some of those are about the text, and some are about myself.

**Tips**: Set a reminder; use software you are comfortable with; make the journaling process as simple as possible; use voice memos if you are not in a conducive place to writing; and use a journaling Bible. At the bottom of this article, you'll find a list of suggestions for journaling Bibles.

#### 2. Be creative

Journalling does not have to involve writing paragraphs exclusively. Try drawing pictures, writing your thoughts as song lyrics, composing a poem, writing a letter to someone about what you have read, writing a blog article about what you have read (send it to me, and I might publish it for you!), making a YouTube short, creating a picture on <a href="Stencil">Stencil</a> or <a href="Canva">Canva</a> and posting it on Instagram.
