Psalm 91 - Are We Safe?

Psalm 91 is our Scripture thread throughout January. Over and over again it promises us safety.

"...he will save you ...He will cover you...you will find refuge...You will not fear...terror...arrow...pestilence... plague...no harm will overtake you, no disaster will come near your tent... his angels [will] guard you... you will not strike your foot...You will tread on the lion and the cobra; you will trample the great lion and the serpent...I will rescue him; I will protect him...I will answer him; I will be with him in trouble; I will deliver him and honour him. With long life I will satisfy him and show him my salvation."

But - *are* we safe? We often feel vulnerable. To be human is to experience pain. How do we make sense of the Psalm 91 promises?

One of my favourite authors is Dallas Willard. He discusses the idea that life in this world can be "totally safe" with God in his book "The Divine Conspiracy." He explores how living in God's kingdom transforms our perspective on safety and security. Willard emphasises that when we live in the reality of God's presence and care, we are ultimately safe, even in the face of life's challenges and suffering.

He wrote:

"This world is a perfectly safe place for us to be—as long as we are in the kingdom of God."

Willard elaborates that this safety doesn't mean the absence of pain or danger but rather the assurance of God's presence and ultimate sovereignty over everything. It's about living with the confidence that nothing can separate us from God's love and that our eternal well-being is secure.

"For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 8:38-39)

So, *are* we safe or *aren't* we? Perhaps the last word on this is from Psalm 56.

"When I am afraid, I put my trust in you. In God, whose word I praise—in God I trust and am not afraid. What can mere mortals do to me?...In God, whose word I praise, in the LORD, whose word I praise—in God I trust and am not afraid. What can man do to me?" (Psalm 56:3-4; 10-11)
